A New Generation of Deaf Leaders will Emerge from Sam's Place

Equipped with a Technology-Based, Christian Education, Sam's Place Graduates Will Lead East Africa into a New Era of Hope for Deaf Children

The AIDs epidemic has caused catastrophic damage to families with children throughout the African continent. Nowhere has this tragedy been more devastating than in Kenva. Families struggle to take in the children of family members who have succumbed to the virus. But there are limits. As a general rule, deaf children have no place in the extended families and are viewed as defective, often abandoned by their relatives who take in the healthy children but reject the deaf, blind, or infirm. Just a few years ago, 2.3 million Kenyan children were orphans. It is estimated that in 2010 that number will increase to 2.5 million. Of that number 46% are AIDs orphans, the single largest group generating deaf orphans everywhere. As a consequence, hundreds of thousands of deaf orphans in Kenya have no safety net within their biological families. What can we do? How can we help the hundreds of thousands of deaf orphans?

There are many deaf orphanages in Kenya. Some are crude sheds that house ten or fewer children, all living in squalor and poverty. Still others are larger,

with one or two hundred deaf orphans. The standard of living is low and the future for these children is limited. In spite of hundreds of these many desperate orphanages littering the Kenyan landscape, they reach but a tiny few of the total deaf children at risk. Most deaf orphans are left to fend for themselves. So what is the answer?

The answer lies in the deaf children themselves, and God's plan for the world. Take a small group of forty deaf orphans, give them a 21st technology-based education that will equip them to live and work in the deaf and the hearing world. Add to that education, a life filled with love and the nurturing of a Christcentered, comprehensive Bible education. The result will be a

generation of young deaf adults who will be comfortable in both the deaf and hearing worlds. After years of instruction and experience using 21st century technology, they will leave Sam's Place with an education superior to that found anywhere in Kenya or East Africa. These bright and confident young adults will be much sought after in the Kenya business world for the education and skills they have. These Sam's Place graduates will build a new life for themselves and enter the middle class where they will make a difference for Kenya. But they will do much more.

Growing up at Sam's Place, the children will learn of Jesus and his plan for missions throughout the world. They will

\$50,000 Challenge Gift Received to Finish Construction at Sam's Place

On February 1, 2010 Sam's Place received a \$50,000 challenge gift from a Christian couple in Tulsa to finish construction. The challenge gift will provide matching funds to raise \$100,000 to finish the dormitory, the vocational building, and the multipurpose dining room/classroom/church building. The challenge grant is in two parts:

1. For the dormitory—there are twelve rooms upstairs, six in the boy's wing and six in the girl's wing. We are asking families to fund each of the twelve rooms with a gift of \$5,000 per room. Each room sponsorship will provide for furnishings, technology access, fixtures, electrical, and finish work for four orphans who will live in that room. Widows will live in one room in each wing and serve as house mothers

By the end of January 2010 we had received funding for two room sponsorships with cash donations of \$10,000, and during early February, a \$25,000 challenge gift was received to fund five additional rooms, if other families would fund the remaining five rooms. One new sponsorship of \$5,000 was received immediately, triggering a matching grant of \$5,000, bringing a total of four dormitory room funded in full. Four additional sponsorships are needed to complete the dormitory room funding and qualify for the remaining \$20,000 in challenge grant funds.

2. The vocational and multi-purpose buildings will be less expensive metal buildings built on concrete slabs. The estimated cost of the two buildings is \$50,000. The challenge grant will match all construction gifts, dollar for dollar, up to \$25,000. So gifts totaling \$25,000 for the two buildings will qualify for an additional matching grant of \$25,000.

All donations used for Sam's Place construction or sponsorships for orphan rooms received beginning February 1, 2010 or after qualify for the matching grant—up to \$50,000 in matching funds. Since the matching grant is for construction, Endowment, Education, and Operations Fund gifts do not qualify for the matching program

The Sponsor an Orphan program will be rolled out in May 2010 to assist in funding the care and education of the orphans who come to Sam's Place. Together with earnings from the Endowment Fund, each orphan sponsor will provide \$35 per month for clothing, feeding, and educating our

orphan students.

Teacher and Staff Training to Begin in June

In April 2010 Jerry Drennan and Vernon Williams will travel to Kenya to hire teachers and staff for Sam's Place, work with Simeon on the final construction tasks to be done, engage in oversight activities at Sam's Place and missionary operations, and prepare for an intensive time of training scheduled to take place in June. This year's mission team traveling to Kenya will open Sam's Place, and operations will begin with teacher and staff training. The 2010 team will include a number of professional deaf educators, deaf preachers and teachers, and those who are specialists in the use of technology in the educational environment.

For the first time Sam's Place will host the annual Kenya Deaf Prayer and Learning Workshop. Deaf church leaders from all over Kenya will gather to celebrate the beginning of Sam's Place and use the facilities for Bible study and other workshop activities.

It is expected that the first orphans will arrive at Sam's Place later in the summer as the facility comes online with furnishings and the equipment needed to operate the school and orphanage.


